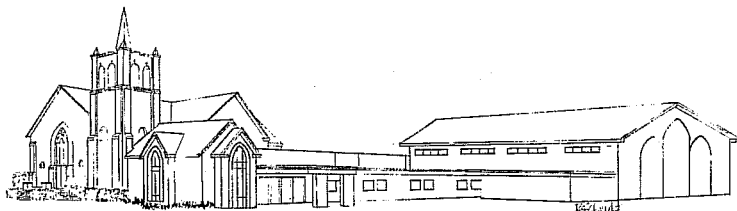

## Pastor's Page ~

**DECEMBER 2011 Eagle ~ V. 475**

How many times have you heard it said: "How do we keep Christ in Christmas?" Often the true meaning of Christmas gets lost amidst the frantic pace of the season. Now here are two ways to help us all to keep Christ in our Christmas.

First is to practice daily devotions. In the Gathering Area you will find an Advent devotional booklet written by Max Lucado. He is an amazing Christian author.

Second is to come to worship and hear a Sermon Series based on the booklet you are using for your daily devotions. The title of Max Lucado's Advent devotional is: *Celebrating Christmas With Jesus*. Max invites us to walk with him through the days of Advent. He writes: *"It was a night like no other. A night that forever punctuated the timeline of history. A night that introduced hope to humanity. God became man and came into our world – to live as we do and to know laughter and tears, pain and joy, hurt and compassion. His story is a collection of monumental moments that remind us that Christ cared enough to experience life with us. Some moments show us he loves us enough to change the course of hopeless situations - a lunch bucket of fish and bread that fed thousands, a leper's skin made baby-soft. Other moments show us he understands our questions, our crying out – the death of a dear friend, the grief of a parent, the garden of agony. Christmas is the time to remember that Christ not only came, he stayed, he lived, he cared. Christmas is more than one remarkable event. It was...the beginning."*

Advent begins on Sunday, November 27<sup>th</sup>. That is DAY 1 in your devotional book. You will be able to experience every great moment of the life of our Lord through this 30-day devotional. Allow our Savior to

become the center of your Advent season, and the center of your life.

Our worship during the Saturdays and Sundays of Advent will focus on the daily readings assigned for those days. So on Saturday and Sunday Pastor Mark and Dave Hudson will be preaching on *two texts*. Come to worship and celebrate the life of our Lord and see how our two preachers pull this one off!

**December 3-4** - DAYS 7 and 8 of your Devotional Booklet

Theme – Forgiveness at the Well and Healing Through a Broken Roof.

Texts – John 4:5-15 & Mark 2:1-5, 12

**December 10-11** - DAYS 14 and 15 of your Devotional Booklet

Theme – He Frightens His Friends and Saves a Stranger

Texts – John 6:16-21 & John 8:3-11

**December 17-18** - DAYS 21 and 22 of your Devotional Booklet

Theme – He Washed Their Feet Before Their Last Meal

Texts – John 13:3-5 & Matthew 26:17-20, 26-30

I hope this will help us all to keep Christ in our Christmas.

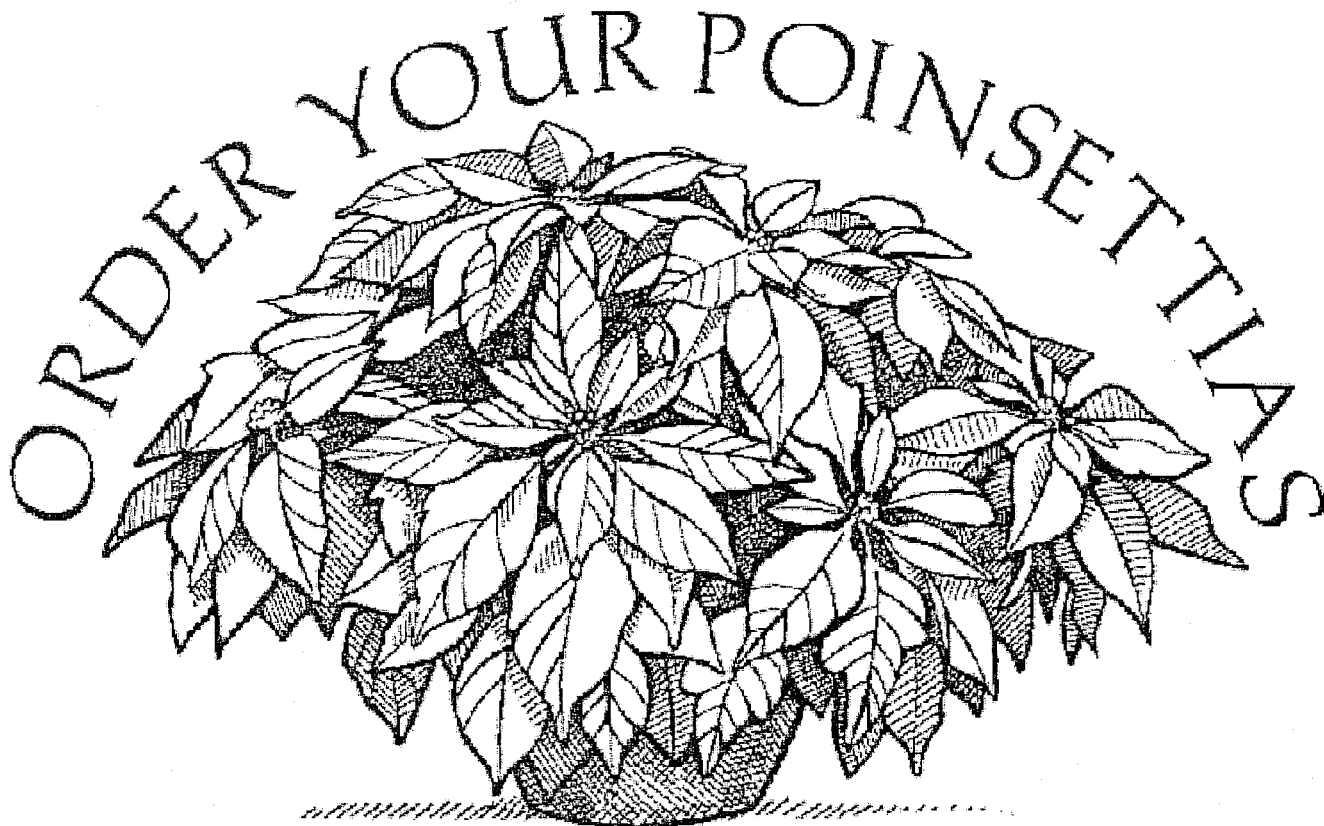

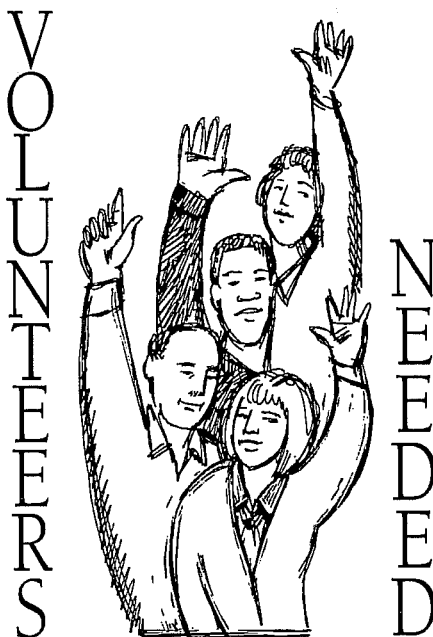
